

### *So much more than just a table!*

Don't settle for rows or random placement of tables. You've already paid for the venue and tables, so room layout is a FREE way to add a lot of impact to your reception.

- Long, rectangular tables can be made interesting by doing any of the following:

Place two side by side to create one large square table.

Place two tables together in an "L" shape.

Stop there, or- place two "L's" near each other to form a square. Be sure to leave room to walk all the way around.

Mix long tables with round tables, being sure to form a pleasing pattern.

- Round tables can be given new life with any of these tricks:

Use various sizes- 60", 48" and 30" are all options.

Set tables in clusters of 3, forming a triangle. Reverse the "point" table with every other grouping, and leave extra space between each set of 3.

- Serpentine tables are a less-used, but interesting option and can be formed into very large circles, or snake-like squiggles.
